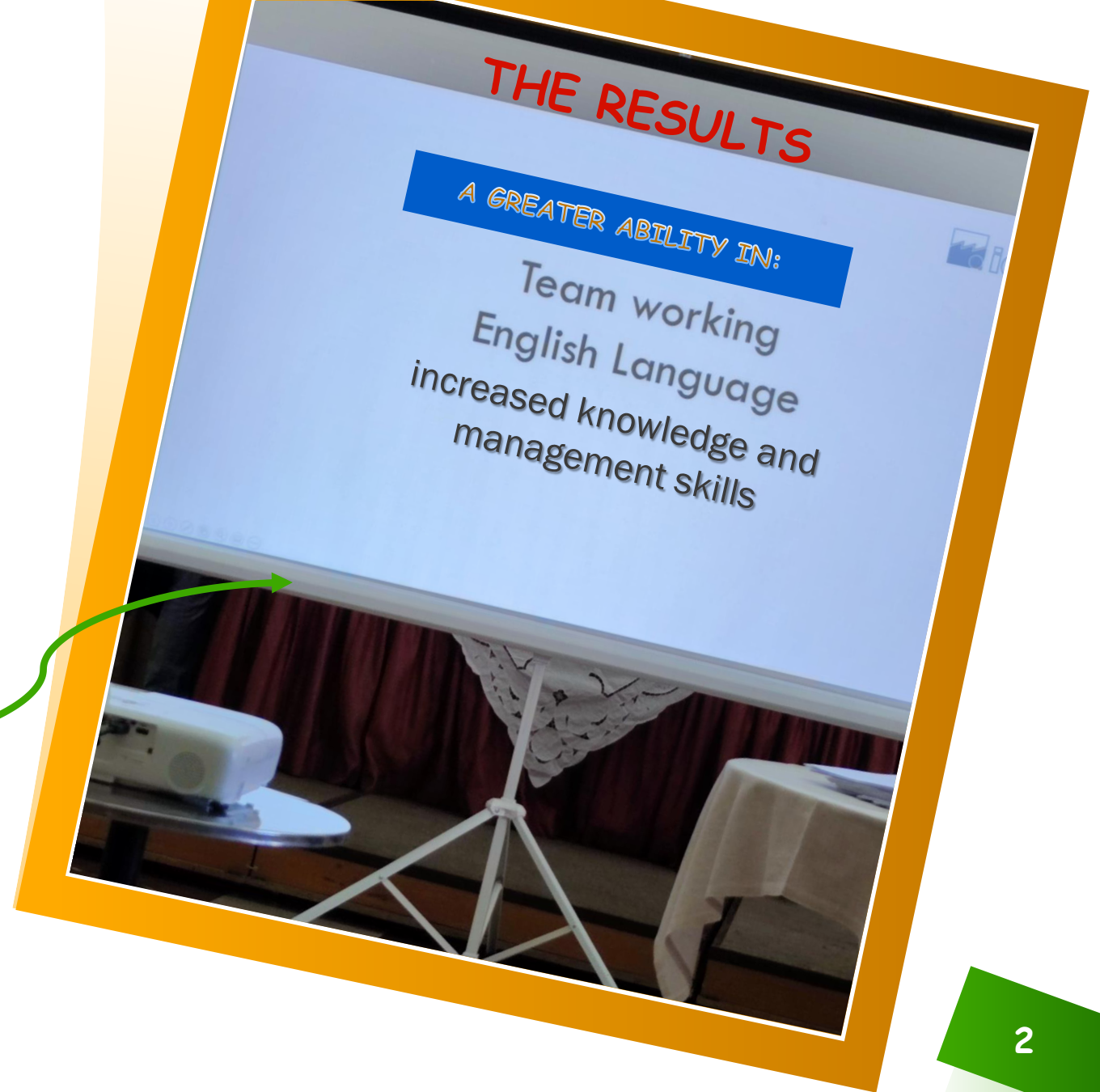

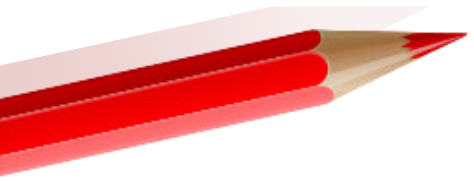


the main ingredients of the experience




F.O.C.U.S METHOD FOR ADHD STUDENTS

FOCUS is the mnemonic developed to outline this learning strategy. Each key word is an action verb that cues students on what to do.

Memory device		Indented association
Focus on speaker		<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Eyes and mind on the speaker✓ Resist talking to the neighbours✓ Keep your hand and feet quiet
Open your mind		<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Ignore distractions✓ Be ready to learn and remember✓ Set your mind on the subject✓ Your mind works only when it is open✓ Think about what is being said
Connect		<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Try to relate what you hearing to things that already know and are related to the lesson✓ Create a picture in your mind of the new information✓ Listen comments of the other students
Use your eyes		<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Pay attention to the book, or blackboard or other visual materials
Select		<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Select the important parts so you can remember✓ Say the important parts to yourself with your words✓ Ask questions to make sure that you understand.

POSTER GRAB- ACTIVITY




We will wrap up the course with a poster grab. You have to walk around the room and look at all of the posters around while, during that time, I will be playing some lively music (no more than 5 minutes).

This exercise summarises key points and also helps delegates to place their own interpretation on those points.



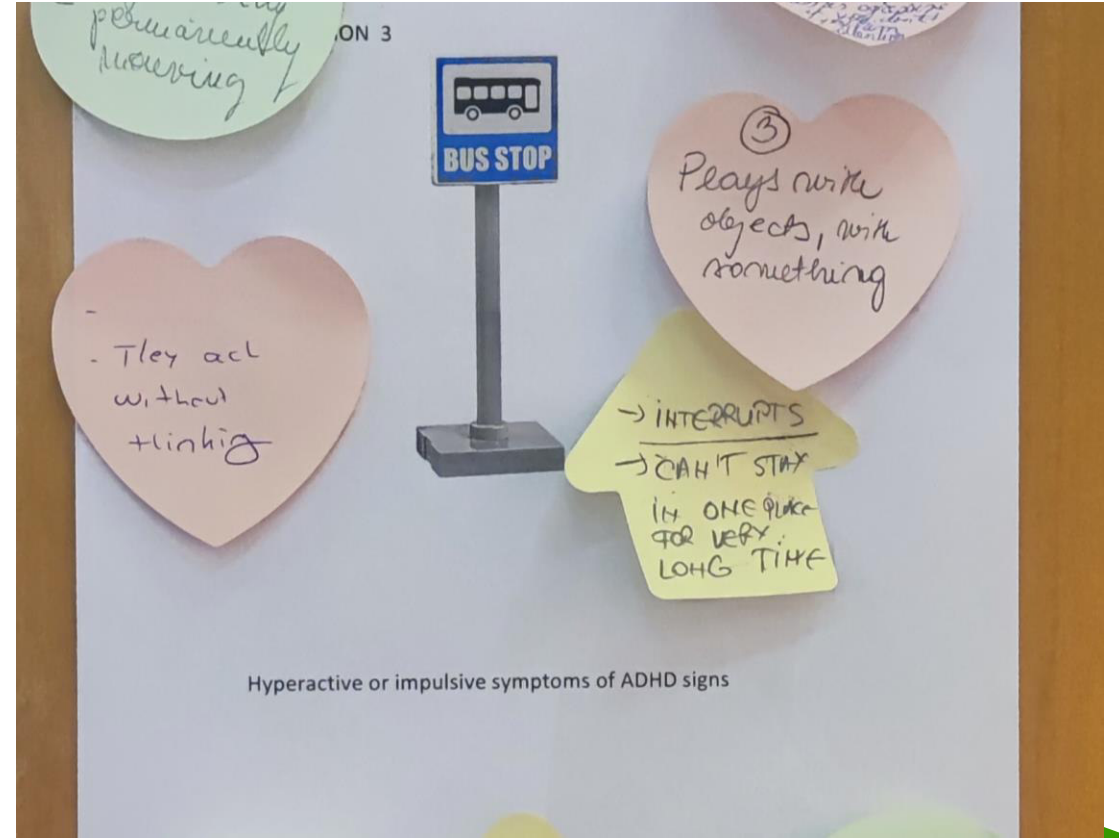
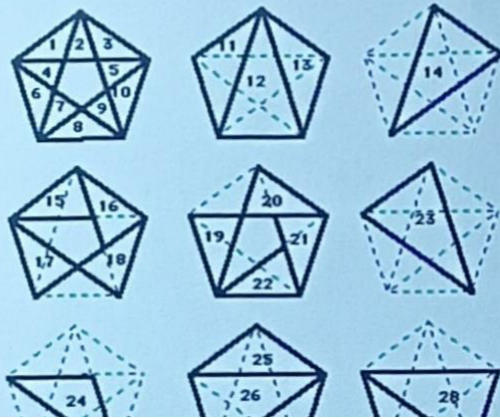
